Program from 6/10/2008: Membership Day! Bob Anderson of Buttonwood was our speaker. Sweet crude is the highest quality oil and the most rapidly declining. Sour crude has lots of imperfections and sulfur to take out. This is what is mostly coming in now. Horizontal drilling goes down in the ground then horizontally to avoid tons of vertical drilled wells. Bob talked about the oil sands in NE Alberta, Canada - the size of Florida. Starting pay is \$100,000 and you'd save a lot because there's not much to do. The U.S. needs to be serious about where we're getting our oil. We have it around here yet environmentalists prevent us from getting it.
